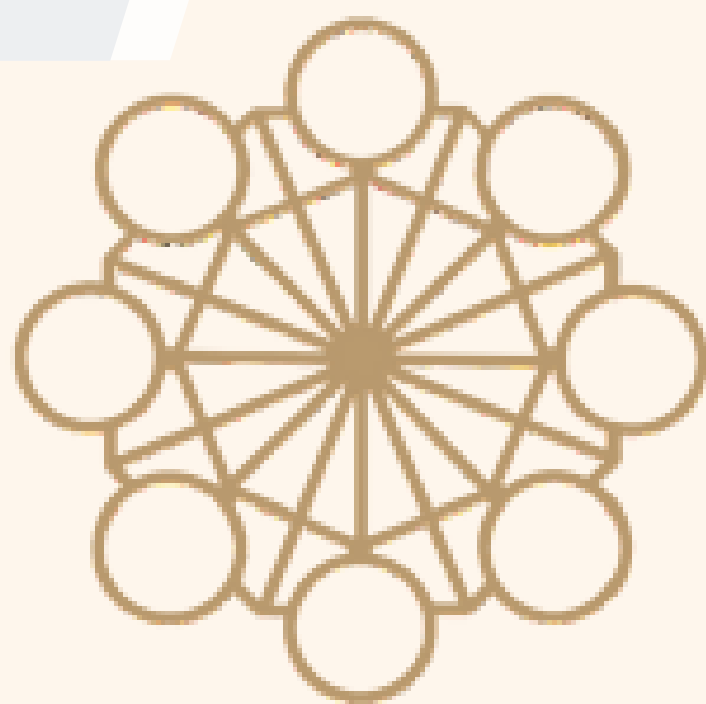

As we have previously informed you, as Academics at Risk Association, we established our stand at the Frankfurt Book Fair between 18-22 October in building number 4, which is reserved for scientific publications and organizations. Members of our managing board were present at our booth every day.





At our stand, we promoted and sold two books, a painting exhibition, the AHIM decision, a call for publications for our Journal, the Association's annual report and various brochures explaining the vision, mission and story of the Association. The first of the books promoted was 'The Rise of the Palace State', a collection of a series of articles describing the political change in Turkey between 2017 and 2018. We also promoted and sold our book 'Bize de Gurbet Düřtü', which was compiled from the stories sent to the story writing competition organized by our association last year.







**In addition to our books, we exhibited the paintings specially prepared for our association by an associate professor who is a victim of decree laws and we shared the stories of the exhibited paintings with the visitors.**





**There was a lot of interest in our booth and the approach of the visitors was very positive. Also, we had the opportunity to establish good networks including international large-scale organizations. In order to develop new collaborations, we conducted several meetings with some organizations including Rutgers University, Penn State University, Sage Publication, The Institution of Engineering and Technology, London School of Economics, Colombia Business School, the German Publishers and Booksellers Association, East View, Science at Risk, Gerlach Press, Ukrainisches Institute.**



The Thompson family, founders of Columbia Business School Publishing, visited us and we talked about the problems that our members have experienced in Turkey in recent years.



The Science at Risk team talked about how the war affected science in Ukraine, and we exchanged ideas on how to support refugee academics.



In our meeting with Ms. Shoman, editorial director of Sage Publishing, we stated that our members were having difficulties finding resources and we were very excited to feel her warm support.
